(Lawrence, KS) – In partnership with the Lawrence, Eudora and Baldwin City school districts, the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department will hold several school-based public H1N1 clinics in November.

- **Saturday, Nov. 7** – 10 a.m.-2 p.m., Baldwin High School, 415 Eisenhower St., Baldwin City.

Both the nasal mist and injectable vaccines will be available at the clinics. As part of the national H1N1 vaccine program, vaccine will be provided at no charge.
