### **Health Department announces H1N1 clinics**

**(Lawrence, KS)** – Beginning Dec. 7, the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department and area pharmacies will make the H1N1 vaccine available to all members of the public.

For a list of Douglas County pharmacies offering the H1N1 vaccine, visit the Health Department's Web site at [www.ldchealth.org](http://www.ldchealth.org). Please note that the list may change as more pharmacies are added. Pharmacies may charge an administrative fee.

Upcoming Health Department clinics also are for anyone who wants protection from the virus. As part of the federal vaccination program, the H1N1 immunization will be available to the public at no charge.

The clinic schedule is:

- **Dec. 12-** 9 a.m. to noon, Health Department, 200 Maine St., Lawrence.
- **Dec. 15-** 9 to 11 a.m., Lecompton United Methodist Church, 302 Elmore, Lecompton.
- **Dec. 15-** 6 to 8:30 p.m., Health Department, 200 Maine St., Lawrence.
- **Dec. 16-** 6 to 8:30 p.m., Health Department, 200 Maine St., Lawrence.

More clinics in Eudora and Baldwin City are planned and will be announced at a later date. The Health Department encourages children under 10 who have received their first dose of the H1N1 vaccine, to receive their second booster immunization at the upcoming clinics. A period of one month must have passed between the child's first and second doses.
