Eudora, Baldwin H1N1 vaccination clinics canceled

(Lawrence, KS) – Due to the impending snow storm, the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department has canceled two of this week's H1N1 vaccination clinics.

Today's clinic at Eudora Middle School in Eudora and the Thursday, Jan. 7 clinic at Baldwin High School in Baldwin City have been canceled. These clinics will be rescheduled; new dates are being finalized.

The Jan. 9 and 12 vaccination clinics will still take place. They will be:

- **Jan. 9-** 9 a.m. to noon, Health Department, 200 Maine St., Lawrence.
- **Jan. 12-** 3 to 6 p.m., Health Department, 200 Maine St., Lawrence.

The H1N1 immunization is given at no charge and is available to anyone who wants protection from the virus. No appointment is necessary.

The vaccine is also available at some Douglas County health care providers and pharmacies. Check with your provider or to see a list of pharmacies and clinics offering the immunization, visit the Health Department's Web site at www.ldchealth.org. Please note the list may change as more providers are added. Pharmacies and clinics may charge an administrative fee.

The Health Department encourages children under 10, who have received their first dose of the H1N1 vaccine, to receive their second booster immunization at the upcoming clinics. A period of one month must have passed between the child's first and second doses.

To help expedite the process, clients planning to be immunized at Health Department H1N1 clinics are encouraged to download a consent form at www.ldchealth.org, fill it out ahead of time and bring to a clinic. A second consent form must be filled out for children receiving their second dose.
