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Project LIVELY conducts annual Client/Community Partner Survey

(Lawrence, KS) – The results of the Project LIVELY Client Satisfaction and Community Partner surveys reaffirm the program’s importance in serving the needs of Douglas County seniors. The surveys were conducted in late spring.

Project LIVELY (Life, Interest and Vigor Entering Later Years) assists older adults by coordinating the help they need to remain in their homes as long as possible. The program, which is unique to Douglas County, was established in 1982.

Approximately 118 Project LIVELY clients or family members took the client survey. In the Community Partners survey, 31 professionals from various community agencies responded.

In the Client Satisfaction survey, clients agreed or strongly agreed with 97 percent of questions asked. Some of those questions included: “Project LIVELY services help you remain in your home,” and “Your care manager is knowledgeable of community resources and programs.”

In the Community Partners survey, 100 percent of those surveyed agreed or strongly agreed with the survey questions. Some of those questions included: “Project LIVELY services help increase the continuity of care in Douglas County,” and “Project LIVELY care managers make it possible for my agency to serve aging adults in Douglas County.”

One client commented, “... I can’t tell you how important this help is nor how grateful I am. I couldn’t have managed without the help of Project LIVELY.”
