

- Kansas Governor Laura Kelly announced last week that she has extended to May 3 the [statewide stay-home order](#). Douglas County Unified Command leaders are grateful that many people are staying home and remind residents to [follow CDC guidelines](#) on wearing cloth face coverings if you do make an essential trip or work in an essential job.
- The governor yesterday and Local Health Officer Dr. Thomas Marcellino in a message to healthcare providers announced expansions to the criteria to qualify for COVID-19 testing. Along with all our partners, we anticipate that this will increase the number of tests performed.
- After suspending most Clinic Services in March due to the COVID-19 response, Lawrence-Douglas County Public Health beginning Monday, April 27, [will reopen limited clinic services](#) on Monday, April 27.
- Our travel-related definition of transmission means the person likely contracted the disease while he or she was outside of Douglas County.
