

### Other Information

- Unified Command leaders thank the 11,405 Douglas County residents who participated in the first wave of the online COVID-19 survey April 17-20. About 1 percent of respondents, 114 people, reported symptoms that include fever, persistent cough and shortness of breath that had not resolved in the past two weeks. “According to this survey data, we would say at the moment, we are not symptom-free,” said Dee Vernberg, Senior Analyst with Lawrence-Douglas County Public Health, “so it’s important to keep following the stay-home order and practicing social distancing, including [wearing a mask or cloth-face covering](#) if you go out in public.” [Read more](#) highlights of the survey results. The second wave of the survey is expected to begin in coming days.
- Kansas Gov. Laura Kelly earlier this week announced expansions to the criteria to qualify for COVID-19 testing. Along with all our partners, we anticipate that this will increase the number of tests performed.
