

- In our second population survey, [167 of the 8,559 residents who responded reported](#) they were currently experiencing two or more symptoms consistent with COVID-19 that began within the last two weeks of April. With recently relaxed testing protocols, anyone currently experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19 is encouraged to contact his or her primary care physician. Anyone without a primary-care provider can call the Lawrence-Douglas County Public Health Coronavirus hotline, 785-856-4343, where nurses are available to provide initial screening and if needed, directions on how to get tested.
