

Current LMH Health Inpatients Positive for COVID-19: **2**

After a recent spike in COVID-19 cases, Douglas County’s local health officer issued two orders this week, one that [requires masks in indoor public spaces](#) or in situations where keeping 6 feet of social distance cannot be maintained and another that [closed bars and nightclubs](#) beginning July 3. We are also asking [patrons who attended](#) Bullwinkles on June 20, 26-27 to monitor for symptoms.

“We have seen a rise of cases among younger adults, and these cases are now being linked to higher-risk older adults in our community. We have to slow down the spread of the coronavirus in Douglas County to prevent a surge of cases,” said Douglas County’s Local Health Officer Dr. Thomas Marcellino.
