

- The [new cases](#) that we report each weekday are the ones we report to you as we know about them — when the COVID test result is completed and we are informed by the KDHE that the person is positive. The 14-day moving average graph shows when the COVID test was performed on each positive case, which is a standard measurement. The data are graphed at the earliest dates when a person was tested for COVID-19 and it came back positive.
- We also have a large number of cases become inactive this week. Given the increase in the number of cases identified a few weeks ago, we expected a large number of cases to start to become inactive around this time.
